If we want to live a life that is pleasing to God, then we need to own up to Him STRAIGHT AWAY when we do something wrong. Also we need to put it right with the person we did it to. This way, we keep our life clean in God's sight, and He can help us and answer our prayers.

6. There is another important rule that God gives us about prayer. It is found in **1 John Chapter 5, verses 14 & 15**. Write out these verses.

This verse tells us that we must ask ACCORDING TO GOD'S WILL (what God wants). God is glad to give us through our prayer everything that is good for us.

Psalm 84:11 tells us, "no good thing does he withhold from those whose walk is blameless." But sometimes, because we don't see things as God does, we ask for things that would harm us if we received them.

"Susan," called a girl to her friend. "We are going to have a picnic on Saturday and lots of us will be there. Will you come along and join us?" "I will ask my mother," replied Susan and ran around the house to ask her. In a little while she returned and reported: "Mother says she will think about it." "Oh bother," exclaimed her friend. "Don't leave it like that. Go pester her until she says 'yes'." "It isn't necessary to pester my mother," said Susan. "If she thinks it is best for me, I know she will let me go, and if she doesn't let me go, she probably has something nicer in her mind anyway."

It is so wonderful to know when our prayers have not been answered, that either it is not God's time or that He has something nicer in His mind for us. God is so good to His trusting children! We can just leave everything to Him.

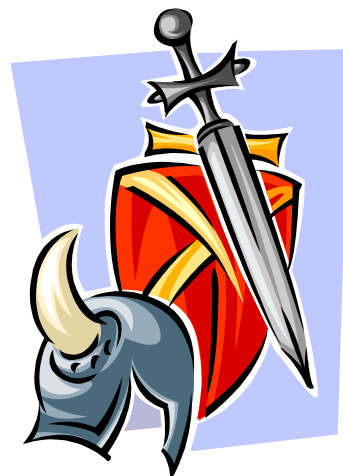

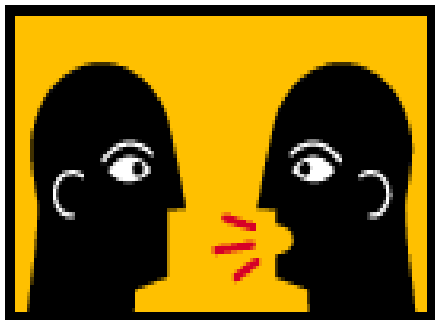

Here is **2 Corinthians Chapter 9, verse 7** from three different versions of the Bible, to help you to understand what it means.

“Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.” (*New International Version*)

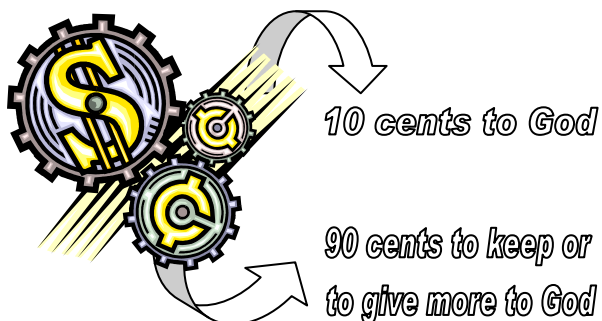
“Each one should give, then as he has decided, not with regret or out of a sense of duty; for God loves the one who gives gladly.” (*Good News Bible*)

“Every one must make up his own mind as how much he should give. Don’t force anyone to give more than he really wants to, for cheerful givers are the ones God prizes.” (*Living Bible*)

*The Bible teaches that a tenth of all that we have belongs to God and if we keep this to ourselves we are robbing God. In **Malachi Chapter 3, verse 8**, we read: “Will a man rob God? Yet you are robbing Me. But you say, ‘How are we robbing you’” In tithes and offerings.”*

A tithe is a tenth (10%) of all that we have, including our money. An offering is anything we give to God that is more than our tithe. If we really love the Lord with all our hearts we will want to give Him our tithe, plus an offering as well.

Suppose a person got \$1.00 pocket money, and they wanted to give a tithe to God. A tithe, or one tenth of \$1.00 is 10 cents. So they would give 10 cents to God. Perhaps as well as a tithe they wanted to give an offering to the Lord also.



We can give money to the Lord by giving to:

- The Church
- The Sunday School
- A Missionary
- Anyone in need
